

REPORT OF A LENTEN QUIET DAY ORGANISED BY FORWARD IN FAITH CHICHESTER





Over 30 people gathered in the rural church of St Mary the Virgin Barnham, West Sussex, for a Lenten Quiet Day organised by Forward in Faith Chichester on Saturday 28th February. The speaker was Bishop Alan Chesters who gave two addresses and celebrated Mass at

12 noon.

Everyone was appreciative of the Bishop's thoughtful reflections and between his addresses participants were engaged in silent contemplation and reading in the peaceful and beautiful surroundings of this ancient church. A hearty soup lunch was provided by ladies from St Mary's.

The day concluded with Benediction given by Fr. Mark Gilbert SSC, Chairman of Forward in Faith Chichester and the Society Bishop's Representive in the Diocese. The Walsingham Prayer was recited at the image of Our Lady after Benediction. Quiet Days were also held in Eastbourne and Haywards Heath on the same day, all organised by the diocesan branch of Forward in Faith.

St. Mary's Barnham is one of three village churches each with different traditions but united as a single parish for over 20 years. There is a lively and growing congregation with many young families and a firm commitment to the Catholic Faith. The church building was saved from closure in the 1990s and is now shared with the local Roman Catholic community whose chapel in the village closed in 2005.

The episcopate in the Church of England is now open to women. The package that allows this development also includes a way for the Church of England to remain together despite the differences of belief that are held about the General Synod's decision.

The House of Bishops' Declaration describes a way for parishes to resolve to have priests and bishops whose sacramental ministry is assured for those who cannot receive the ministry of a female bishop based on their theological conviction. The way in which this works will be monitored by an Independent Reviewer. A parish that makes this resolution will remain an active part of the diocese and deanery, and will be free to flourish and grow because of the confidence they have in the ordination of their clergy.

So, what do we do now?

Principles, which give us a guarantee that the Catholic theological understanding of ministry will continue to be given an honoured place in the Church of England.

- 1. Women as well as men can be bishops in the Church of England, and are to be respected, and
- 2. Everyone needs to acknowledge that this is the decision that has been made by the Church of England, but
- 3. This is a decision made without the agreement of the whole of the Church worldwide, so it is part of a wider process of discernment throughout the whole Church.
- 4. Disagreeing with the decision remains a legitimate Anglican position, and the Church of England is committed to allowing those who disagree to flourish within its life and structures, and
- **5**. Pastoral and sacramental provision will be made for them, without a time limit, in a way that maintains as much communion as is possible, and contributes to mutual flourishing.

The five principles in practice. Gracious changes to the actions



At Bishop Philip North's consecration, before the service the Archbishop of York briefed the congregation on what was about to happen. He made it clear that Archbishops always had the right to delegate a consecration to another bishop. He also affirmed that he would be seen as the Provincial, and though the other bishops would form a circle round the candidate and be praying for the gift of the Spirit at this time only three bishops would lay on hands, the Bishop of Chichester, with the bishops of Pontefract and Beverley. He stressed that this decision had been taken long before there was even the name of the first woman bishop, and finally, almost as an emphatic aside, he said that there was no question of "taint" about the non hand laying bishops. He almost shouted "there is no such thing"!

We had a very encouraging day in February when we gathered together Priests across the Diocese who were interested in making a declaration to become Society Priests and many have now made that declaration. The Bishop of Horsham led us by Celebrating Mass and giving us a charge.

There are plans for a Regional Residential for clergy with neighbouring Dioceses to explore how we can go forward. These plans are in the pipeline.

Diocesan Synod Elections

By the middle of May notice of the new elections for Diocesan Synod will be sent out. The actual election period is in June. Please do consider standing for election or ensuring that we have a reasonable number from your deanery. Too often there are vacancies in both the houses of laity and clergy which we could easily fill. You do not have to be a member of Deanery Synod to stand for election – just be on the electoral roll of your parish church.

Why is it important that we are represented on this body? As members of the Diocesan Synod we are able to vote for those on the various boards and councils and in particular the Bishop's Council and the Vacancy-in-See committee. If we are not represented we will not have a vote. Diocesan Synod members also have the opportunities to take part in debates about the Diocese and the wider Church.

Please consider how you can contribute in this way by standing for election yourself or finding others to do so.


