As the Blessed Sacrament is brought to the altar all shall sing, or the individual worshiper joining the devotion shall say quietly:

Seek ye first the Kingdom of God
And His righteousness
And all these things shall be added unto you
Allelu Alleluia

Man shall not live by bread alone
But by every word
That proceeds from the mouth of God
Allelu Alleluia

Ask and it shall be given unto you
Seek and ye shall find
Knock and the door shall be opened unto you
Allelu Alleluia
Alleluia Alleluia
Alleluia Alleluia

Then the Celebrant or the individual worshipper says:

"For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him." John 3:16-17

Jesus said to him, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me." John 14:6

"But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth." Acts 1:8

God's kingdom is come, the gift and the goal; in Jesus begun, in heaven made whole. The heirs of the kingdom shall answer his call and all things cry 'Glory!' to God all in all.

Then the Priest Stands and sings the collect:

Lord, may this sacrament of new life warm our hearts with your love, and make us eager for the eternal joy of your kingdom. We ask this through Christ our Lord. **Amen**

Following the Collect, Benediction is given, and then, as the Sacrament is reposed all sing:

If this is the end of the Holy Hour or the Vigil, then all shall sing: Tune: Hanover NEH 433

The kingdom of God is justice and joy; for Jesus restores what sin would destroy. God's power and glory in Jesus we know and here and hereafter the kingdom shall grow.

The kingdom of God is mercy and grace; the captives are freed, the sinners find place, the outcast are welcomed God's banquet to share; and hope is awakened in place of despair.

The kingdom of God is challenge and choice: believe the good news, repent and rejoice! His love for us sinners brought Christ to his cross: our crisis of judgement for gain or for loss.

There follows a period of silence during which the individual worshipper my say the Intercessions from their Daily Prayer at Home leaflet and/or the following:

That the world may know Jesus Christ as the Prince of Peace, we pray: **Your kingdom come.**

That all who are estranged and without hope may be brought near in the blood of Christ, we pray: **Your kingdom come.**

That the Church may be one in serving and proclaiming the gospel, we pray: **Your kingdom come.**

That we may be bold to speak the word of God while you stretch out your hand to save, we pray: **Your kingdom come.**

That the Church may be generous in giving, faithful in serving, bold in proclaiming, we pray: **Your kingdom come.**

That the Church may welcome and support all whom God calls to faith, we pray:

Your kingdom come.

That all who serve the gospel may be kept in safety while your word accomplishes its purpose, we pray: **Your kingdom come.**

That all who suffer for the gospel may know the comfort and glory of Christ, we pray: **Your kingdom come.**

That the day may come when every knee shall bow and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, we pray: **Your kingdom come.**

Almighty God, by your Holy Spirit you have made us one with your saints in heaven and on earth: grant that in our earthly pilgrimage we may ever be supported by this fellowship of love and prayer, and know ourselves sustained by their witness to your power and mercy; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

At the end of the Holy Hour, or every hour during a longer vigil the leader will say:

We come before the Son of God, crucified, risen, and ascended, who eternally intercedes for us to the Father, saying:

All turn our hearts again.

Son of God, you came into the world to save sinners:

All turn our hearts again.

You became poor that we might become rich:

All turn our hearts again.

You have taken on yourself all our sufferings:

All turn our hearts again.

You loved the Church and gave yourself for her:

All turn our hearts again.

For the joy which was set before you, you endured the cross:

All turn our hearts again.

King of the ages, you brought us the gift of life and opened the way to unending joy:

All turn our hearts again.
